Statistics

- □ 1-in-4 women and 1-in-7 men will experience DV in their lifetime
- More than 90% of women who have experienced DV would pursue child support if they could do so safely
- Child and Family Research Partnership, at the University of Texas
 - <u>37 percent</u> of surveyed custodial parents with formal child support orders, reported experiencing domestic violence from their child's other parent at least once by the time their child was 3 years old
 - <u>43 percent</u> of mothers who did not have a formal child support order, and who were not receiving any formal or informal child support, reported experiencing domestic violence by the child's father.
- More than ¹/₂ of families in child support caseload are currently receiving or have previously received cash assistance.



Cooperation Requirements

Child Care: 23 States SNAP: 9 States

In 2017: legislation in 12 states (AL, AK, AR, IN, MS, NH, NC, SC, SD, WA, WV, WI).

13 states have child care requirements in regulation.




Good Cause Exemption

- Federal requirement under PRWORA and states have enacted statutes or adopted regulations to define and apply.
- Data from 2015 shows that 33 states reported less than 1 percent of their TANF caseload with a domestic violence waiver.
- Only a handful of states reported more than 2 percent of recipients being granted a domestic violence waiver.

Family Violence Indicators

Low of .3% to a high of 22.4% of custodial parents with a family violence indicator flag attached to their child support case.




20 States have Legislatively Created
